The use of graphs and excel assignments was very useful for this class. The tests on the other hand were difficult and often didn't make much sense. The tests were entirely from the book, and sometimes the instructor didn't link the lecture and the book together very well.

The course would have been more effective if the spreadsheets had been done all along but spaced out to one to two per week. They were effective and kept my interest.
