Student Internship Application approval by the Department Chair. Fall, Spring, Summer.

<b>Course Content Outline:</b>	Each intern has a job description prepared by the training supervisor and a training agreement signed by the intern, the training supervisor, and the Department Chair.
<b>Teaching Strategies:</b>	Learning by actual supervised experience takes the place of the classroom.
<b>Assessment of the Student's Performance</b>	The training supervisor will complete an evaluation of the student intern. Upon completion of the required hours of internship and all required reports, the student will receive an S grade.
